



# Dimitris Tsougarakis



Dimitris Tsougarakis is Professor of Byzantine History at the Ionian University in Corfu, Greece. He received his D.Phil. from Oxford. Working across the disciplines of history, literature, archaeology, and epigraphy, Professor Tsougarakis has published extensively on such diverse topics as Roman and Byzantine Crete, monasticism, sigillography, lives of saints, graffiti, and oil production. He is currently engaged in several research projects, including the Academy of Athens's project on the monasteries of Crete.
