This huge volume published in only 300 copies includes at least a few articles that should be of interest to those on this list.

I have not looked otherwise at that website, but possibly it contains other files that will interest you. I am impressed that they managed to publish the Tronsky volume in advance of the actual conference.

There are a few articles relating to Byzantine texts including hagiography, one or two on early Slavic translations, an article on the origins of futhark (N. Germanic runic script), and an item that will be of some interest for those who study Muscovite political terminology: Rabinovich, "Vseia Rusi samoderzhets" (pp. 698-711). As the main title suggests, much of the volume pertains to indo-european linguistics and classical philology.
