# Field Equipment that will be supplied for you:

Pick axes, chisels, hammers, shovels, brooms, Walkie Talkies, Optivisors Collecting canisters, field notebook, hand lens Toilet paper, glue/consolidant, aluminum foil Global Positioning System (GPS) Appropriate maps (i.e., Topographic maps, geologic maps), collecting permits, references (key articles, fossil identification guides) Cooking equipment

# Mandatory Field Equipment each person should bring:

### Camping Equipment:

Sturdy tent (to withstand rain/wind) Sleeping bag Sleeping pad Pillow (optional) Tarp for under tent

# Clothing:

Clothing for warm days, cool nights, rainfall Sturdy work/hiking boots (break them in first) Hiking socks Camp shoes/sandals Long pants Belt Sun-shade hat

### Field Equipment:

Sunscreen with high protection Insect repellent Snake gaiters (optional) Mechanical pencils Watch Rock hammer (Estwing 16"; optional)

# Medical Equipment:

Lantern, flashlight, or headlamp Spare batteries Camp chair (if you have room) Water containers (for at least 3 L) Camera (optional)

Wind/rain proof jacket Rain pants (optional) Long-sleeved shirt (light weight) T-shirts Fleece (something warm) Sunglasses

Water containers Whistle Working gloves (optional) Pocket-knife Sturdy backpack Knee-pads (on hands & knees a lot)

(I recommend that you carry the following First Aid items with you)A dozen or so band-aidsSome Ibuprofren/Aspirin/TylenolSome BenadrylNeosporin or Triple Antibiotic CreamSterile wipesGauzeA couple of pairs of latex glovesAce bandageAny medical prescriptions that you needExtra contact lensesAny other personal medical needs (e.g., epi-pins, eye-drops, allergy medication, etc.)Names and phone numbers of emergency contacts
