Task 1a: Free Recall

In a free recall task, a participant is asked to review an artifact (e.g., chess board, architectural design, etc.) for a specified period of time. The artifact is then removed and the participant is asked to write down everything that he/she can recall about the artifact.

The focus of this free recall task is the email included below. You will have two minutes to review the email. After that point, the email will be removed and you will be asked to write down everything that you can remember about the email.

Task 2b: Retrospective Protocol

In a retrospective recall task, a participant is asked to reflect on a task that they have completed and then to describe, in as much detail as possible, the process that they used to complete the task.

Task 3: Word Association

In a word association task, a participant is given a probe (i.e., word or phrase) and asked to list all words or phrases that come to mind when thinking about the probe. For example, if the participant were presented with the probe – *French fry* – their list might include: potato, fried, fattening, ketchup, waffle, skinny, McDonalds, tastes good, etc. As this example list indicates, the items in a word association list can include nouns, adjectives, phrases, proper names and could even include verbs and adverbs.

In this word association task, the probe is **expert**. You will now have two minutes to write down all words or phrases that come to mind when thinking of the term **expert**.
