#### Artifact Description

I recommend examining President Ronald Reagan's speech following the explosion of the Space Shuttle Challenger on January 28, 1986. Reagan had to address the nation immediately following the Space Shuttle explosion. This shuttle mission included as one of the crew members Christa McAuliffe, a school teacher. Consequently many schoolchildren had watched the failed launch.

## Justification of the Artifact for this day

Many have commented on Reagan's skillful use of imagery in this speech. Reagan was faced with the challenge of mourning the explosion and the loss of life while at the same time recommitting the American people to the exploration of space. This required a delicate blend of public emotion and civic values. Moreover, Reagan makes special use of key metaphors to advance his goal, relying quite heavily on pioneer metaphors. He likens the crew to frontiersmen pulling the country into the future and ends by linking them to Francis Drake. Given this chapter's focus on imagery in particular, Reagan's speech serves as an excellent case study. Additionally, the speech ranks quite highly on AmericanRhetoric.com's list of the best speeches. It succeeded at the time by securing public support for more NASA funding and it has outlived its immediate context as a model of elegant American oratory.
