Show *all* your work. Reasonable supporting work must be shown for any partial credit.

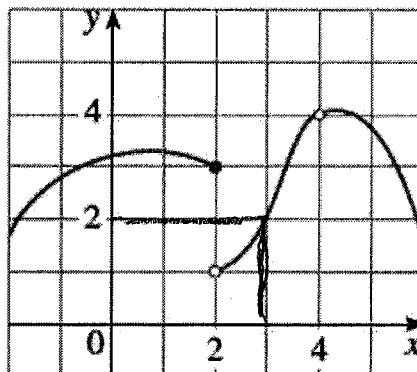
1. [3] (§2.3 #2 & WebHW1#1) Use the graph of f below to find the limits (either numerically, graphically, or algebraically), if they exist:

$$\lim_{x \rightarrow 3} [f(x) + f(x)] = \lim_{x \rightarrow 3} f(x) + \lim_{x \rightarrow 3} f(x) \quad (+1.5)$$

$$= 2 + 2 = 4 \quad (+1.5)$$

$$\lim_{x \rightarrow 2} f(x) \quad \text{DNE} \quad \text{note } \lim_{x \rightarrow 2^-} f(x) = 3$$

$$\text{and } \lim_{x \rightarrow 2^+} f(x) = 1 \quad 3 \neq 1$$



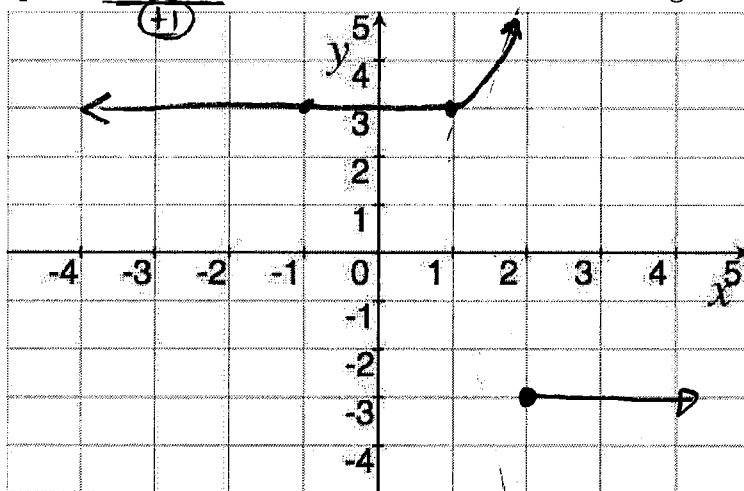
2. [4] (Limit Activity #3) Sketch the graph of a function α that satisfies *all* of the following:

(a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -1} \alpha(x) = 3$ (+1)

(b) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2^-} \alpha(x) = \infty$ (+1)

(c) $\alpha(2) = -3$ (+1)

Note: there are MANY right answers!



- 3 [3] (WebHW2#0) Let $f(x) = 4x^2$. Find $\lim_{h \rightarrow 0} \frac{f(1+h) - f(1)}{h}$

$$\lim_{h \rightarrow 0} \frac{f(1+h) - f(1)}{h} = \lim_{h \rightarrow 0} \frac{4(1+h)^2 - 4}{h}$$

$$= \lim_{h \rightarrow 0} \frac{8h - 4h^2}{h} = \lim_{h \rightarrow 0} \frac{8 - 4h}{1} = 8 - 4(0) = 8$$

$$f(1+h) = 4(1+h)^2 = 4(1+h)(1+h) = 4(1+h+h+h^2) = 4 + 8h + 4h^2$$

$$f(1) = 4(1)^2 = 4$$
