

## Mean Value Theorem §4.2

- Consider the function  $f(x) = \cos 2x$  with a domain of  $[\pi/8, 15\pi/8]$ .
  - Verify the three hypotheses of Rolle's Theorem.
  - Find all numbers  $c$  that satisfy the conclusion of Rolle's Theorem.

- Exhibit the Mean Value Theorem for  $y = x^3 + x - 1$  on the interval  $[1, 2]$ .

Notice  $y = x^3 + x - 1$  is a cubic polynomial which are known to be cont.

$\therefore y' = 3x^2 + 1$  so  $y = x^3 + x - 1$  is differentiable.

The mean value theorem implies

There exists a  $c$  between 1 and 2

$$\Rightarrow \text{that } f'(c) = \frac{f(2) - f(1)}{2-1}$$

where  $f(x) = x^3 + x - 1$ .

So that means there exists a  $c$

$$\text{so that } 3c^2 + 1 = \frac{[2^3 + 2 - 1] - [1^3 + 1 - 1]}{2-1}$$

$$3c^2 + 1 = \frac{9-1}{1}$$

$$3c^2 + 1 = 8$$

$$3c^2 = 7$$

$$\Rightarrow c^2 = \frac{7}{3}$$

$$c = \pm \sqrt{\frac{7}{3}}$$

for  $c$  to be between 1 and 2

$$c = \sqrt{\frac{7}{3}}$$
