

CAUGHY FAMILY GENEALOGY

(Pronounced “Ca-hee” in northern parts of Ireland, while southern dialects pronounce it “Caw-hee”; in America, it’s “Caw-gee” or “Coy”)

1. John CAUGHY, born 1666, died Kircubbin, County Down, Northern Ireland, 17 May 1762; buried Ballyhalbert Graveyard (Old), Ballyhalbert, County Down, Northern Ireland; headstone reads: “Here lyeth the body of John Caughey, late of Roureagh, who departed this life May 17th 1762, aged 96 years. Likewise, his wife Janet Bodin who departed this life May the 21st 1762, aged 78 years. Also the remains of Edward Caughey of Ballylimp who departed this life March 19th 1794, aged 87 years (findagrave.com/memorial/202460470/john-caughey); married Janet Bodin, born 1684, died Kircubbin, County Down, Northern Ireland, 21 May 1762; buried with husband and son (findagrave.com/memorial/202460571/janet-caughey); at least two children.

Alexander Caughey, born 1698, died Kircubbin, County Down, Northern Ireland, 25 December 1761; buried Ballyhalbert Graveyard (Old), Ballyhalbert, County Down, Northern Ireland; headstone reads: “Here lyeth the body of Alexander Caughey late of Kirkubin, who departed this life, December 25th 1761, aged 63 years” (findagrave.com/memorial/202221119/alexander-caughey); listed as a church warden in the nearby Balligan Church in 1737; married, name unknown; at least one child.

Samuel Caughey, born Craigaruskey, County Down, Northern Ireland, 1732; died Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland, 11 March 1809, aged 77 years; buried Killinchy Church of Ireland Churchyard, Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland; headstone reads: “Erected by John and Hamilton Caughey of Ballydorn in memory of their mother Mary Caughey who departed this life 12th Sept 1785 aged 60 years. Also the remains of their father Samuel Caughey of Craigaruskey who departed this life 11th March 1809 aged 77 years. Also the remains of Agnes Caughey, daughter of the above John Caughey, who departed this life 22nd May 1815 aged 17 years. Also in memory of the said John Caughey who departed this life 6th May 1830 aged 70 years. Also Sarah Caughey, daughter of the said Hamilton Caughey, who departed this life 28th Feb 1835 aged 22 years. Also the remains of Margaret Caughey alias Patton, wife of said John

Caughey, who died 10th July 1837 aged 76 years” (findagrave.com/memorial/203338769/samuel-caughey); married Mary Hamilton, born 1725, died Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland, 12 September 1785, aged 60 years; buried with her husband (findagrave.com/memorial/203338813/mary-caughey); at least three children.

Children of Samuel Caughey and Mary Hamilton:

Hamilton Caughey, probably born in the 1750s, but dates of birth and death unknown; initially thought to have immigrated to Baltimore, but still fathering children in Ireland right through until 1813 (Ursula) and 1820 (James); he inherited land from his father in Craigaruskey, Killinchy, in 1809; married Alverta Patton; at least six children.

- ii. John Caughey, born 1760, died Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland, 8 May 1830, aged 70 years; buried with his parents (see above); married Margaret Patton, born 1761, died Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland, 10 July 1837, aged 76 years; at least two children.

ii. Agnes Caughey, born 1798, died Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland, 22 May 1815, aged 17 years; buried with her father and grandparents; no issue.

iii. Patrick Caughey, born 1770, Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland. In 1794 immigrated to Baltimore, Maryland where he established a successful grocery business, died 1862; married Elizabeth Dixon, born 1781, died 1826. 7 children, including Elizabeth Ann Caughy who later married John Hamilton Caughy, the son of Patrick's nephew Michael.

2. Michael CAUGHY, born 15 March 1790; died 15 June 1866; emigrated from Killinchy, County Down, Northern Ireland, to Baltimore, Maryland, apparently sometime before his marriage on 4 December 1816, to Dorcas Walker, born Baltimore, 16 July 1800, died Baltimore, 4 February 1878 (daughter of Henry Walker, born Baltimore, 25 May 1769, died 30 January 1799; and Hannah Wagner, married 6 August 1793, died 18 April 1820; and sister of Noah Walker, born Carroll County, Maryland, 23 January 1796, died Dumbarton, Baltimore County, Baltimore, 3 February 1874), Rev. Reese presiding; both buried at Green Mount Cemetery, Baltimore; at least four children.

Children of Michael Caughy and Dorcas Walker:

i. John Hamilton Caughy, born Baltimore, 1820; a clothier; married Elizabeth Ann Caughy (daughter of Patrick Caughey), probably born Baltimore, 1820, died Sunday, 2 December 1906 (following a short funeral service at her home, 1705 Baker Street, her body was taken to St. Gregory's Catholic Church, where a high mass was celebrated by Rev. P. J. Walsh; the pallbearers were Messrs. M. Clark, P. H. Caughy, M. McClusker, W. Kessling, H. Sorell, and J. Roeder; buried in St. Peter's Cemetery, Baltimore; see the *Baltimore Sun*, 6 December 1906); eight children.

Children of John Hamilton Caughy and Elizabeth Ann Caughy:

Michael Patrick Caughy, born Baltimore, March 1845; died Baltimore, April 1917 (buried 2 April 1917); married 1871 to Mary Rosana Pendergast, born Baltimore, January 1855, died January 1929, daughter of Captain Charles Pendergast of Wexford, Ireland, a descendant of Sir Maurice de Prendergast who participated in the conquest of Ireland (i.e., a Flemish mercenary employed by the Normans to help control England and Wales; he later continued his military career in Ireland, eventually joining the Knights of St. John of Jerusalem. He became prior of the order's house at Kilmainham and died there in 1205); a clerk for city government; both

buried at New Cathedral Cemetery, Baltimore, sect. H. lot 544, plots 1 and 2; at least one child.

Michael Pendergast (born 1791, died 1867) and Ellen O'Brien; sister of Mary Pendergast who married Michael Caughy (mother of Rev. Walker S. Caughy, pastor of St. Stephen's Church, Washington, and widow of Mr. Samuel Hamilton Caughy, died Wednesday afternoon at her home, 222 West Madison street, of diseases incident to old age; she was born at Havre de Grace, Maryland, 75 years ago, and was a daughter of the late Capt. Charles Pendergast; beside Father Caughy she leaves two other sons, Mr. Charles M. Caughy, American Consul at Messina, Italy, and Mr. Frank J. Caughy, of this city; she also leaves two daughters, the Misses Vertie and Addie Caughy; the funeral will take place this morning at the Cathedral, where a mass of requiem will be celebrated by Father Caughy, son of the deceased; interment will be in Bonnie Brae [New Cathedral] Cemetery; see the *Baltimore Sun*, 20 March 1903, p. 7); in 1880 the household employed four servants (see 1880 Maryland census); nine children.

“Former Baltimorean Expires at His Home after a Long Illness. Charles M. Caughy, who for a score of years (1893–1913) had been connected with the United States Consular service (appointed by President Cleveland), and who was a native of this city, died today at his home, 219 Governor Street, Richmond, Virginia. He had been in ill health for a number of years, but last December fell and broke a hip bone, this together with his other ailments, caused him intense suffering and finally brought on the end, which came at 6:55 o'clock this morning after seven long months of illness. Expressions of regret were heard on all sides in this city today when the news of his death arrived here. The funeral will take place in Richmond and burial will be in the Higgins family lot in that city [no Caughy gravestone evident in Higgins plot at Mt. Calvary cemetery as of 2005].

Mr. Caughy opened his eyes to this world on June 4, 1850, and was the son of the late Samuel Hamilton Caughy and Alice A. Pendergast of Baltimore. He was a journalist and literary man of brilliant attainments, and was in touch with many players, authors, and artists. Genial, clever, bright, witty, gifted, and accomplished in many ways, Mr. Caughy was a man generally beloved. He spoke several languages, and had translated a number of works of use to the government. Mr. Caughy was associated with the late George A. Gardener in the publication of *Every Saturday*, a

weekly journal devoted to literature, art, and dramatic affairs. In 1893 he was appointed United States consul in Messina, Sicily by President Cleveland, where he remained for 14 years. After that he was transferred to Malaga, where he remained two years, and from there was transferred to Milan, where he was located at the time of his recent serious illness. Mr. Caughy, with his family, left Messina just before the great earthquake, when the American Consul and his wife lost their lives and the consulate was destroyed. During Mr. Caughy's term as American consul to Messina, Malaga, and Milan he upheld the dignity of his office in a manner to elicit very complimentary comments from the American authorities. With Mrs. Caughy he entertained visiting officials, and made a favorable impression with the excellent system by which the office was conducted. He was a tactful diplomat on all occasions, but at the same time gave sympathetic attention to the troubles of the poor who frequently came to him for advice and care, and often sacrificed himself in order to render assistance to those who came to him in his official capacity. He aided the distressed, visited the sick and afflicted and distributed charity in every place where needed. Nothing was left undone to make his record an enviable one in personal and private matters, as well as in the strict rendition of the duties of the position. Mr. Caughy was fortunate in gaining many friends among the nobility and royalty, but at the same time valued highly the friendship of people of the humbler walks of life. He was the true American representative, ready at all times to answer questions and give information, and his favorite motto was, "We are never too old to learn." Mr. Caughy, with his family, left Milan the day after Christmas, 1912, a very sick man, and a week after reaching America, in an effort to walk across his room, fell heavily, breaking a hip bone. Owing to the shock in his weakened condition from the advanced stages of diabetes and Bright's disease, he had been critically ill ever since. Throughout his sickness he had an earnest desire to become strong enough to visit Baltimore and see again his many friends here. Mr. Caughy came under the head of the merit system and had he lived would have been promoted much higher with considerable increase in salary. The best years of his life were given in consular work. Six years ago he went to London to consult noted specialists on diabetes, who told him the doctors of Sicily were starving him, the treatment had been too severe and sudden, and he never recovered entirely from the effects. The London physicians put him on a diet, which he followed until his death.

On January 20, 1880, Mr. Caughy married Miss Mary Alice Higgins (died 7 February 1926), daughter of the late John M. Higgins (born 25 February 1832, County Sligo, Ireland, died 20 July 1906, Richmond, Virginia) and Kate C. Dempsey (born 10 March 1836, Cashell, County Tipperary, Ireland, died 22 August 1892, Richmond, Virginia). The ceremony was performed in the Richmond Cathedral by Archbishop Keane, and was the first nuptial mass at which he officiated after his consecration to the

dignity of archbishop. Besides the widow, Mr. Caughy is survived by two children. The son, Clinton Norbert Caughy, is connected with the theatrical firm of Liebler & Co., of New York, and is stage manager of the Children's Theater, that city. The daughter, Miss Mary Kathleen Caughy, made her debut in Washington society last season, and is considered a very beautiful and brilliant young woman. He also leaves a brother (Frank) of the well-known real estate firm of Caughy, Hearn & Carter, this city, and two sisters (Mrs. Oliver Carroll Zell and Miss Adelaide Caughy)."
