

# Knee Arthroscopy

What to expect after your operation – Dr. Roger Larson

# Symptoms to report to the doctor:

- Calf pain
- Fever greater than 100°F
- Pain not controlled by pain medication
- Excessive bleeding
- Redness or swelling around incision site
- Any problems with the medication such as nausea, rash, itching, or difficulty voiding

# **Activity**

- Elevate operative leg for the first 48 hours.
- Weight bearing as tolerated.
- Use crutches if needed.

## **Dressing**

- May shower after surgery. Keep incision covered with plastic wrap.
- Remove dressing in 48 hours and cover with Band-Aids.
- Wear the support stocking on operative leg. Change it daily.

#### **Pain**

- Use ice packs or cryocuff on incision site for first 24 hours and as needed.
- Elevate leg.
- Use pain medication as told.
