QUESTIONS

- 1. In your own words, describe what Descartes means by a ``method'' in his Rules for Direction of the Mind.

Although you are not required to do so, you might enjoy rereading Descartes' first meditation and comparing the order in which he raises doubts there.
- 3. In *Principles of Philosophy*, Descartes summarizes several sources of erroneous beliefs. Describe three sources, and give your own (concrete) example of each type.
