Description of the course:

Polish 402 is the second class in a three-quarter course sequence of **first year (beginning) Polish**. Students should be familiar with the material covered in Polish 401 (first 19 chapters of *Dzień Dobry*). After the whole year's sequence the students should be able to be creative with the language at the sentence level, handle basic everyday life situations, read simple connected texts dealing with basic personal and social needs, write short letters, postcards, diary entries, take down simple notes (e.g. phone messages), etc. The goal is to move from Novice Low to Novice High/Intermediate Low on the ACTFL Proficiency Scale.

Key topics covered in Polish 402:

I. Vocabulary: telling time, basic daily activities, days of the week, months, dates, verbs of

motion, food and drink and meals, shopping and money

II. Grammar: plural of nouns, locative case, dative case, adverbs, comparison of adjectives,

aspect of verbs, past and future tenses
